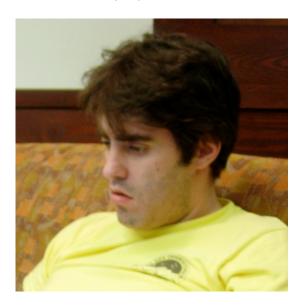
Brief Bio and (PR)²: Problems & Pitches – Rants & Raves by Gregor J. Rothfuss
